CPNP FOUNDATION TO PROVIDE TWENTY-FIVE STUDENT GRANTS FOR CPNP 2020

The CPNP Foundation is proud to announce the continued funding of student registration and travel grants to CPNP's annual meeting. Thanks to CPNP Foundation donors, the number of grants available for CPNP 2020 has increased, and the Foundation will provide scholarships for up to 25 students to attend the Annual Meeting April 26-29, 2020 in Dallas, Texas!



CPNP Foundation President Cindy Kirkwood extended her appreciation by saying, "The CPNP Foundation Board of Directors is very grateful to the CPNP members and CPNP Past Presidents who made these grants possible. With your generous support, we can continue to support the next generation of psychiatric pharmacists and grow our discipline. On behalf of the CPNP Foundation, thank you so much!"

The <u>online application portal</u> is open for applications with the final deadline to submit an application being **January 15, 2020**. To be eligible, applicants must be a full-time pharmacy student in pursuit of her/his first professional pharmacy degree, a paid student member of CPNP in good standing, and must not have previously received this grant. Students applying for a registration/travel grant must complete an online application and provide a current curriculum vitae; a personal essay of no more than 500 words describing the applicant's interest in CPNP and psychiatric pharmacy, including objectives for attending the meeting; and one letter of recommendation from either a clinical pharmacy practitioner or faculty member using the <u>Letter of Recommendation template</u>. A full list of <u>grant</u> <u>criteria</u> can be found online.

The CPNP Student Committee will facilitate the grant selection process after the application deadline, and notifications will be sent by February 12, 2020. Each student recipient will receive a full student registration to the <u>2020 CPNP Annual Meeting</u> (\$300 value) and a \$200 travel stipend. These grants are possible because of the generous support of CPNP members and the CPNP Past Presidents' Destiny Fund, which specifically supports student registration and travel grants.

UPCOMING DEADLINE FOR DEFINING THE FUTURE GRANT

Applications are currently being accepted for 2019 **Defining the Future** Research Grants! This annual grant program is designated specifically for students, residents, and fellows interested in psychiatric and neurologic pharmacy. Projects and scholarly research pursuits will be considered for the grant, and all submissions must align with the vision and mission of the Foundation, which can be viewed on the <u>CPNP Foundation website</u>. CPNP Student Chapters are also encouraged to apply and will need to designate one individual to be the point person for the grant.

Grant applications must be submitted through the <u>online application portal</u> by 11:59 p.m. Central Time, August 31, 2019.

Up to four grants of \$1500 will be awarded to support the projects of the selected individuals or groups. Recipients will be required to submit their project results as an abstract for poster consideration at the 2020 CPNP Annual Meeting to be held April 26-29, 2020 at the Hyatt Regency Dallas in Dallas, Texas. CPNP FOUNDATION TO SUPPORT MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID AT CPNP 2020

The CPNP Foundation is proud to once again support the Mental Health First Aid Pre-Meeting Workshop at the CPNP Annual Meeting. <u>Mental Health First Aid</u> is an 8-hour course that teaches participants how to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders.

Mental Health First Aid was first created in Australia in 2001 by Betty Kitchener, a nurse specializing in health education, and Anthony Jorm, a mental health literacy professor. The United States is just one of the many countries that have adopted the program. According to

<u>MentalHealthFirstAid.org</u>, today, over 1 million people across the United States have been trained in Mental Health First Aid by over 11,800 instructors.

Mental Health First Aid will be offered at the Hyatt Regency Dallas April 25-26, 2020, and registration will open soon. Following the event, participants will receive a certificate from Mental Health First Aid USA acknowledging certification which is valid for 3 years. A limited number of spaces are available, so interested individuals should reserve their seat early as possible after registration opens.

DONOR SPOTLIGHT: JOSHUA HOLLAND, PHARMD, BCPP

The CPNP Foundation enjoys recognizing donors who exemplify the values of the Foundation through their dedication and commitment to meeting the needs of patients living with psychiatric and neurologic disorders and their families. In this issue of Kaleidoscope, we feature **Joshua Holland, PharmD, BCPP.**

Dr. Holland was a 2011 CPNP Foundation Founding Circle Member and has been a consistent supporter of the Foundation ever since. He is currently a clinical psychiatric pharmacist at CoxHealth and a preceptor for their residency program.

What was your first position in psychiatric pharmacy?

I first started working as a psychiatric pharmacist at CoxHealth in Springfield, Missouri. It is a 70-bed, acute-care psychiatric facility. I have worked at this facility for the past 10 years. I have always enjoyed trying to understand more about how the brain works and why people do the things they do. I had my first exposure to psychiatric pharmacy in class at North Dakota State University. My instructor was Amy Werremeyer, and if you have ever met her, you can understand why I was sold on psychiatric pharmacy as a career.

How has CPNP and the CPNP Foundation impacted your career?

CPNP has been a huge help in providing me education and, more importantly, an opportunity to network with other pharmacists outside my area. I have met some amazing people at the CPNP conferences and found many opportunities to impact the profession. The CPNP Foundation is another great way for me to support the profession currently as well as in the future.

How do you envision the CPNP Foundation making a difference in your life and/or the lives of patients and caregivers?

CPNP can greatly impact what psychiatric pharmacy care looks like in the future, and I think it is great that the CPNP Foundation sponsors research done by psychiatric pharmacists.
