### **Help the Dallas Homeless**

The CPNP Foundation is coordinating the assembly of toiletry kits for <u>The Bridge</u>, a multi-service organization that offers basic needs services along with access to physical and behavioral health care for the homeless. Here is how you can show how you care:

- Donate items for the kits. From now until April 1, you may purchase items from our Amazon Wishlist to
  be included in the toiletry kits. After April 1, you may compile items to bring with you in your suitcase to
  contribute! Items needed include small sizes of shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, toothbrushes
  (individually wrapped) and toothpaste. From April 26-28, drop off the items at the Foundation tables during
  CPNP 2020.
- Donate money to increase the number of kits. Our goal is to assemble as many kits as possible! The
  CPNP Foundation will be contributing items for toiletry kits, but we need your help to increase our impact.
  From now until April 1, money can be donated <u>online</u>. Please add "CPNP 2020 Kits" to the order comments
  to ensure that the funds are allocated to this project.
- Write encouraging notes. We will be adding a note of encouragement to each toiletry kit. Supplies will be available at the Foundation table during CPNP 2020 while they last.
- Assemble toiletry kits. Swing by the Foundation tables during CPNP 2020 and assemble a few toiletry kits. An assembly station will be available Sunday, April 26 through Tuesday, April 28. Join us Wednesday, April 29 from 7:00-8:00 AM to assemble all remaining kits that will later be delivered to The Bridge.

## **CPNP 2020 STUDENT GRANT APPLICATIONS DUE JANUARY 15**

The CPNP Foundation is proud to announce the continued funding of student registration and travel grants to CPNP's Annual Meeting. Thanks to CPNP Foundation donors, the number of grants available for CPNP 2020 has increased to allow up to 25 students to attend the Annual Meeting April 26-29, 2020 in Dallas, Texas!

The <u>online application portal</u> is open, and all applications are due January 15, 2020. To be eligible, a student applicant must be a full-time pharmacy student in pursuit of her/his first professional pharmacy degree, a paid student member of CPNP in good standing, and must not have previously received this grant. A full list of <u>grant criteria</u> can be found online.



The CPNP Student Committee will facilitate the grant selection process after the application deadline, and notifications will be sent by February 12, 2020. Each student recipient will receive a full student registration to the 2020 CPNP Annual Meeting (\$300 value) and a \$200 travel stipend. These grants are possible because of the generous support of CPNP members and the CPNP Past Presidents' Destiny Fund, which specifically supports student registration and travel grants.

## MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID TO BE OFFERED IN DALLAS AT CPNP 2020 ANNUAL MEETING

The CPNP Foundation is proud to once again provide financial and logistical support to bring Mental Health First Aid to the CPNP 2020 Annual Meeting. The 8-hour course will be offered over two days, April 25-26, 2020, at the Hyatt Regency Dallas hotel. Attendance is limited to 60 participants.

Mental Health First Aid is a nationally-offered, 8-hour course that teaches participants how to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. The course was first created in Australia in 2001 by Betty Kitchener, a nurse specializing in health education, and Anthony Jorm, a mental health literacy professor. The United States is just one of the many countries that have adopted the program. According to MentalHealthFirstAid.org, over 1.6 million people across the United States have been trained in Mental Health First Aid by over 15,000 instructors.



Following the training, participants will receive a certificate from Mental Health First Aid USA acknowledging certification which is valid for 3 years. Participants with a PharmD will also be able to earn 8 hours of ACPE credit through the National Community Pharmacists Association (NCPA). Mental Health First Aid will be available to participants of all levels, however, individuals who are trained in mental health will find the information to be basic.

A modest registration fee will be required to attend <u>Mental Health First Aid training at CPNP 2020</u>. Registration will be available soon and will conclude when 60 individuals have registered or on March 26, 2020, whichever comes first.
